BASD Quarantine / Returning to School Criteria:

In alignment with requirements in Title 28 Pa. Code Chapter 27 (relating to communicable and noncommunicable diseases), schools must:

- Report positive cases of COVID-19 to DOH for case investigation, contact tracing, and issuance of quarantine and/or isolation orders; and
- Exclude school children and staff from having contact with other school children or staff showing symptoms of a communicable disease.

Students and Staff who have symptoms of a communicable disease will be excluded from school in accordance with Title 28, PA Code Chapter 27.

SYMPTOMATIC Staff and students with symptoms associated with COVID-19 must stay home.

- Symptomatic individuals may return to school when:
 - At least 5 days have passed since symptom onset.
 - And At least 24 hours have passed since resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications and other symptoms have improved.
 - OR Provide a negative COVID test and fever free for 24 hours
 - OR Cleared in writing by Healthcare provider and fever free for 24 hours.
 - Strong Recommendation to wear a well-fitting mask for an additional 5 days.

POSITIVE COVID tests

- Excluded from school and require a quarantine of 5 days
- May return to school on day 6 IF:
 - Symptoms are resolving
 - Fever Free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications.
 - Strong Recommendation to wear a well-fitting mask for an additional 5 days.

It is Strongly Recommended that a well-fitting mask is worn through day 10 after any COVID-like illness or positive test.

Contact Tracing after Exposure to COVID 19

- School Personnel will continue to contact trace and notify students of a known exposure to COVID
- It is strongly recommended that any person exposed to COVID-19 should wear a well-fitting mask for 10 days.
- It is Strongly Recommended by BASD to follow quarantine recommendations from the CDC and the DOH:
 - Stay home for 5 days after your <u>last</u> contact with a person who has COVID-19 (unless fully vaccinated and asymptomatic or tested positive for COVID in the last 90 days).

Exposed to COVID 19 at School or other Non-Household Exposure:

- Recommendation is to quarantine for 5 days (if not vaccinated or had COVID in the last 90 days) and stay away from others, especially people who are high risk.
- Watch for fever (100.4°F), cough, shortness of breath, runny nose, sore throat, headache, loss of taste or smell, vomiting, diarrhea.
- Enroll in Test to Stay Program
- If symptoms develop, exclude from school, and treat as a symptomatic case (see symptomatic case above).

For a household member who tested positive for COVID

- The Positive household member must guarantine for 5 days. (See Positive COVID test above)
- Households should quarantine and contact their health care provider for instructions.
- <u>It is strongly recommended</u> that all household members complete a quarantine period of 5 days (unless fully vaccinated and asymptomatic) and tested on day 5.
- <u>It is strongly recommended</u> that anyone who is not positive will quarantine an additional 5 days <u>after</u> the positive family member's initial 5 day quarantine, while monitoring for symptoms (10 days from the first symptom of the positive family member) and return to school on day 11.
- If symptoms develop, exclude from school, and treat as a symptomatic case (see symptomatic case above).

The following people with recent exposure may NOT need to quarantine:

- 1. 1. People who have been fully vaccinated AND are asymptomatic.
 - Fully vaccinated guidelines include 14 days after primary series is complete.
 - If over 2 months post-J&J, or over 6 months from mRNA vaccines, must have booster to be considered fully vaccinated.
- 2. People who were previously diagnosed with COVID-19 within the past 90 days AND are asymptomatic.
- 3. People who are enrolled in school's Test-to-Stay Program and remain without symptoms.
